### A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF

The Union Fire District is an all-volunteer fire department dedicated to serving and protecting the residents of South Kingstown. The district operates eight fire stations: Peace Dale, Wakefield, Forest Fire, Snug Harbor, Tower Hill, Matunuck, Tuckertown, and West Kingston. Our current membership includes 80 volunteer firefighters. We have been focusing on recruitment and retention through our website and social media presence. Recently, we completed our fourth year of a FEMA grant aimed at supporting these efforts, which successfully increased our volunteer numbers. Additionally, we have established a new Career and Technical Education program with South Kingstown High School to teach firefighting skills to juniors and seniors, potentially creating a pipeline for new members each year.

As Fire Chief, I recognize that we are at a defining moment that necessitates a thorough review of our current status and a strategic plan to meet our future goals and community service demands. The core question guiding this plan is: "How can we improve the Union Fire District, and what direction should we take?" A comprehensive assessment of all aspects of the department and our services has been conducted, resulting in a strategic plan that outlines short, medium, and long-term organizational goals, as well as the objectives needed to achieve them. The successful implementation of this plan relies on our personnel's commitment to embracing the department's vision. I am optimistic that our members will rise to this challenge and support the outlined goals.

The primary goal of the UFD is to provide superior fire protection services while remaining a volunteer fire district. This involves significant efforts in recruiting and retaining volunteers to ensure adequate staffing and timely responses.

# FISCAL MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET

The UFD prioritizes responsible fiscal management for taxpayers. Currently, the UFD has no debt and funds capital improvements through its Capital Project Funds (CPF). For Fiscal Year 2024-2025, the budget totals \$3,727,705.00 a 3% decrease from the previous year.

#### Recent accomplishments include:

- Secured a FEMA grant for \$648,270 for Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response, effective November 10, 2024, to November 9, 2028.
- Construction of a new Matunuck Fire Station at a cost of \$2,674,000, funded through capital project funds with no debt incurred.
- Purchase of three new engines/pumpers totaling less than \$2,500,000, also without debt.



## FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE

The UFD Office of the Fire Marshal oversees fire prevention, code enforcement, and fire investigations. With a full-time Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal, the office conducts over 1,000 site visits annually, including inspections for businesses and schools. Fire prevention education is expanding beyond schools to local housing communities and civic groups, with plans to seek grants to enhance these programs.

### COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS

In December 2020, a bond was approved for a new town-wide radio system, which was implemented in spring 2024. This system enhances communication among all town departments, ensuring outstanding coverage. The UFD continues to upgrade its radio equipment to improve mutual aid capabilities.



## TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Training is crucial for our volunteers. The UFD operates the state's only Class A burn building, providing realistic training scenarios. We offer drills twice weekly and have developed online training programs to accommodate volunteers' schedules. Starting in fall 2024, a high school program will allow students to gain Firefighter Level I certification before graduation.

## FACILITIES AND REAL ESTATE

The Union Fire District's facilities consist of eight fire stations, an administration and training compound, and two vacant lots for future expansion. Ongoing upgrades will modernize these facilities to support volunteer needs.



### RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION STRATEGY

The UFD is committed to enhancing recruitment and retention efforts, recognizing the challenges of volunteer firefighting. Key strategies include:

- Identifying potential volunteer pools
- Conducting public awareness campaign
- Building partnerships with local schools
- Offering stipends and benefits
- Creating a positive volunteer experience through recognition and community involvement

Regular reviews and adaptations of this strategy will ensure its effectiveness in meeting community and district needs.



## PROPOSED GOALS (2025-2030)

- Maintain a robust volunteer fire department of highly trained members
- Complete the Matunuck fire station #7 construction project
- Complete addition to Forestry station #3 to include bunk rooms
- Design and construct a new West Kingston station #9 from the ground up
- Explore and budget for potential live in resident program for our volunteer firefighters
- Expand firefighter online training programs for greater flexibility.
- Continue to successfully implement the high school firefighting career and tech program.
- Continue to fund and support our duty shift program for day and night coverage
- Explore additional collaboration with the Town of South Kingstown on future programs
